With some 40 million people worldwide living with HIV/AIDS, faith communities play a critical role in responding. MCC has launched a 10-year multi-million dollar initiative called Generations at Risk to respond to the growing HIV/AIDS pandemic.

Home care for people living with AIDS

As the number of people with AIDS requiring care continues to rise, hospitals and clinics are unable to cope with the number of patients. Groups of volunteers, largely composed of women, have stepped forward to offer compassionate care to patients in their homes.
\$50 provides a month of care for 50 people living with HIV/AIDS.

Support for orphans and other vulnerable children

As parents become sick and die, children are left alone and grief-stricken. Many churches provide support to orphans by visiting them, providing counseling, and assisting with school fees, food and other basic needs.
\$40 provides a school uniform and a pair of shoes for two AIDS orphans.

Supplies for hospitals and clinics

Many medical facilities do not have the supplies they need to treat patients. By providing HIV blood test kits and basic medications such as antibiotic creams and vitamins, MCC is helping to support under-equipped facilities.
\$20 provides ten HIV rapid test kits for a clinic or hospital.

Education to prevent the further spread of AIDS

Preventing the spread of HIV among individuals may be the most effective way of tackling the disease. Church seminars, youth debates, community dramas, and other forums are providing education on abstinence, fidelity, and other means of risk reduction.
\$150 provides life skills and AIDS prevention training for 180 youth.
